
Participation in Regional Manufacturing Event

PG&E Pipeline Safety Enhancement Plan Update

As a part of PG&E's multi-year Pipeline Safety Enhancement Plan, PG&E is replacing an old existing gas pipeline with a new 24-inch gas pipeline in Fairview Avenue. PG&E has completed the placement of the new pipeline and is finishing up the patch paving. The road configuration from Balfour Road south to just past State Route 4 will remain in place until the contractor has completed the slurry sealing and re-striping (on that portion of Fairview Avenue), which is

anticipated to be completed by the end of July. PG&E will also be doing re-inspection work, connection points and testing of the new pipeline from Balfour Road north to Fairview Court. This work will begin next week and is anticipated to be completed by the end of July, before the new school year begins. The last part of work for PG&E to perform is to slurry seal and stripe Fairview Avenue from Balfour Road north to Fairview Court, which is anticipated to be completed by late fall. Detours will be in place and traffic delays should be expected between the weekday hours of 7:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. and Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. For more information please contact Tony Del Greco of PG&E at (510) 846-1397.
