
Water Conservation – Fall Back for Savings

As the days get shorter and temperatures begin to drop, the need to water your landscape becomes less frequent. During the fall, watering your lawn once a week should be enough to sustain it. When the rains begin, outdoor watering may be turned off. By watering your trees and shrubs by hand once every two weeks starting in November and once a month in December, you will find that your landscape will thrive while saving water. 


Meet a Veteran!
