Recycled Water Fill Station

The City has opened a Recycled Water Fill Station at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, 2251 Elkins Way, for City of Brentwood utility customers. Recycled water is wastewater that has received extensive treatment for many non-potable water uses such as landscape irrigation. The use of recycled water for this purpose is a way for customers to help meet State mandated drought regulations to reduce potable water use.

Customers may bring containers (up to 300 gallons) to fill with recycled water and take for appropriate use. To utilize this recycled water, customers will need to show a valid ID, a recent City of Brentwood utility bill, complete a short application and receive a brief, one-time training on the regulated uses of recycled water. Hours of operation are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.; and Saturday, from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

PG&E Streetlight Upgrade to LEDs

PG&E owns and maintains approximately 800 streetlights in Brentwood. The California Public Utilities Commission has authorized PG&E to upgrade the existing streetlights to energy efficient, light-emitting diode (“LED”) streetlights at no cost to the City. Work is expected to begin **late June**.

It takes approximately 10 minutes for installation per lamp fixture. Work is dependent on safe weather and field conditions. PG&E has notified the residents located in the vicinity of where this work will be performed and there will be no disruption to electrical service. All PG&E and contractor personnel are required to carry valid photo identification and are happy to provide it upon request. This work will have very minimal impact on the traffic in residential streets. On arterial roadways, the contractor will have traffic control in place and no roadways will be closed.
